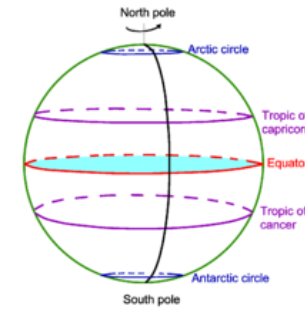

Glacier – a slowly moving mass of ice.

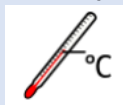


Arid – land that has little or no rain.
