Glossary

City: A city is a large settlement that usually has more than 100,000 people. It usually has:

- Many different types of services, including universities, sports stadiums and a large variety of shops.
- Many restaurants, transport links and different places of worship.
- Many people move to cities because there are more opportunities for employment and leisure.

Town: A mid-sized settlement that can have between 1,000 and 100,000 people. A town will usually have:

- Services such as primary and secondary schools, train stations, hospitals and shopping centres.
- Large supermarkets and at least one place of worship.

Village: A small settlement that can have between 100 and approximately 3,000 people. It will usually have/be:

- In the countryside.
- Some services such as a post office, a small shop and sometimes a small place of worship.
- There may be a doctor's practice and a primary school.
