

Eid	<p>Celebrate the importance of Eid for Muslims and what the festival means</p> <p>Children to make 'Eid' cards to celebrate Eid with their Muslim friends</p>	<p>Children to understand the Ramadan festival and what takes place during the festival.</p> <p>Ramadan lanterns to be created</p>


The crescent moon and star are iconic symbols of Islam, making them perfect for Eid crafts.

### Materials Needed:

- Cardboard or thick paper
- Aluminum foil or gold/silver paper
- Yarn or string
- Hole punch
- Glue and scissors

### Instructions:

- Cut out crescent moon and star shapes from cardboard.
- Wrap them in foil or coloured paper for a shiny effect.
- Punch a hole at the top of each shape and attach yarn.
- Hang them from a stick or embroidery hoop to create a beautiful

### Materials Needed:

- Coloured paper
- Scissors
- Glue or tape
- Markers and stickers for decoration

### Instructions:

- Fold a piece of paper in half lengthwise.
- Cut small slits along the folded edge, stopping before the end.
- Unfold the paper and roll it into a tube, securing the edges with tape or

Our mission is to give every child and young person a book of their own.</a></p> <p>Set up an audio book station (see world book day website)</p> <p>Create reading buddies and read with each other</p> <p>Create a BFG dream jar with baby oil and glitter</p> <p>Research your favourite author and create an info page on them</p> <p>Create your own favourite book characters using old toilet rolls (or rolled card?)</p>  <p>WANTED posters for bad guys in stories eg. Big Bad wolf</p>	

Week Commencing WC 10.3.25	Monday Activity	Tuesday Activity
Science Week	<p>Flower/celery and food colouring activity</p> <p>Children to put flowers in different pots of coloured water. Over the week, make observations of how the flower/celery absorbs water through the roots and stem and transports it to the flower</p> <div data-bbox="343 510 906 824">  <p>Make neon flowers</p> <p>Demonstrate the "magic" leakproof bag</p> </div>	<p>Create bubbles!</p> <p>Use bubble mixture to create a massive bubble with a touch tray and a hoop.</p>  <p>Add soapy water onto the table (thin layer) and blow with a straw to see if you can create a bubble on the table. Can you create a bubble within a bubble?</p> <p>Bubble printing</p> 
Additional ideas	<p>Skittles experiment with skittles around a plate and add some water to watch the colours Blend in</p>  <p>Can you make a toy car travel with a balloon? Get the friction boards out from science cupboard (see SP) and explore how cars travel on different surfaces</p> <p>Give the children a range of items, Can they conduct their own scientific question and answer?</p>	

Week Commencing <b>WC 17.3.25</b>	Monday Activity	Tuesday Activity
Lets Get cooking!	Bake simple fairy cakes or gingerbread men	Can the children decorate the gingerbread men?
Additional ideas	<p>If feeling adventurous... Do a Red Hill Bake off? Children to work in teams with different adults to bake cakes or decorate an existing cake and act as judges (bring SLT in to do official judging/taste testing!!)</p> <p>Design your own dream menu</p> <p>Design a healthy meal.</p> <p>Teach the children how to do simple cooking tasks to build independence eg. How to cook an egg, how to butter toast etc</p> <p>Children to make their own sandwiches for RAP?</p>	

Week Commencing <b>WC 24.3.25</b>	Monday Activity	Tuesday Activity
Healthy me!	Children to have a range of equipment (see EYFS outdoor equipment) and set up obstacle courses. Can they create one for another team and how quickly can they be completed?	Children to learn how to take heartrate/pulse. Children complete a range of exercise tasks and check their heart rate. When is it faster/slower?
Additional ideas	<p>Visit from a dentist to discuss how to brush teeth correctly.</p> <p>Loots of Just Dance videos to keep the children exercising</p> <p>Create a written pact on how you will be healthy for 2025 eg less tv/gaming. Walks daily, eating healthy</p> <p>Design a healthy meal following last weeks learning on healthy eating</p> <p>Yoga videos and mindfulness videos (see Wellbeing Wednesday) for a healthy mind</p> <p>Mindfulness colouring</p>	

Week Commencing <b>WC 31.3.25</b>	Monday Activity	Tuesday Activity
Global Recycling Day	Create a piece of artwork out of recycled materials (gain in advance)	Audit the schools recycling. Do we waste paper in the school bins? What more could be done?

Could you create a world out of recycled milk bottle lids in blue/green?



Create posters for recycling bin and usual bin to be added to all classrooms
