Glossary

Monarch- a sovereign head of state eg. A King, Queen or Emperor

Succession- inheriting a title eg. Queen Elizabeth inherited the role of Queen

Invasion- to invade someone else's land for ownership

Catholic- A branch of the Christian church that accepts the Pope as the leader

Protestant- A branch of the Christian church

Heir- a person inheriting something eg. Heir to the throne will one day rule
