- Research Charles I's role in starting the English Civil Wars and create a PowerPoint summarising your findings.
- Conduct a battle analysis. Research the tactics used by Oliver Cromwell and Charles II and discuss why Cromwell's were successful and what Charles II should have done differently.
- Draw a detailed map of the Battle of Worcester, showing the positions of the Royalist and Parliamentary armies
- Write a letter home from the perspective of a soldier fighting in the Battle of Worcester.
- Create a 3D model or diorama of the Battle of Worcester on the Powick fields.
- Create a short documentary film about the Battle of Worcester

- Record a 'horrible history' style video all about the Battle of Worcester
- Create a timeline of the key events leading to the Battle of Worcester
