

10 House Points:

- ◆ Make a model of a Tudor house (this is for The Great Fire of Red Hill, so please complete by the end of September).
- ◆ Make a model of a fire engine from 1666 using LEGO or cardboard
- ◆ Create a stop animation project of the story of the Great Fire of London
- ◆ Visit the Tudor House Museum for free in Worcester. Take photos of the Tudor House and write down any facts that you learn.
- ◆ WITH AN ADULT, build a fire outside and describe what is needed to make a fire grow.

5 House Points:

- ◆ Draw or paint a picture of the Great Fire of London or a key person within the event
- ◆ Write a diary entry for Thomas Farriner on the day the fire started
- ◆ Cook bread like Thomas Farriner would have done in his bakery.
- ◆ Create a fact file about The Great Fire of London

5 House Points:

Thomas Farriner needed to make 4 loaves of bread for 5 families. How many did he need to bake altogether?
